Pursuant to your request on September 14, 1959, the following information from the Dallas FBI files concerning the aboye captioned subject defines "Scientology" as follows:

Information was received on May 9, 1956, to the effect that a new religion had been formed in Dallas known as "Scientology." The information coming to our attention indicated that this organization had held a meeting one Sunday in 1956 at the YMCA in Dallas. An informant adviced that this organization was formed by L. Ron Hubbard in Washington, D.C., and is known in Dallas as the First Church of Scientology. As of 1956; it was reported to hold its meetings on Sundays in Room Will of the YESA, Jackson and Horth Ervay Streets in Dallas. it was renorted that was in charge of this group in Lallas and aunounced that froe courses could be recolved is Rashington. D.C., by night. It was reported that

Agree . Reason Received in this was ever Rabbled. Mr. Age and informant's bolief that all persons present at the meeting informant attended appeared to be atheists, believing in materialism. Informat stated that the group appeared to believe that all power is in a man's mind. It was informant's opinion that the whole movement night be Communistic because of their atheistic beliefs. Informant made available a book entitled "Brain-Vauhing, A Synthesis of the Russian Textbook on Psychopolitics." This book in informant's belief was obtained from an anti-Communist and the <u>literature therein</u> was originally prepared by a man named or of Fort Worth, Texas. Informant did not believe that this mimeographed book had anything whatever to do with Communica or Communist activities in the United States but believed that the book may have played .
